
## TODAY'S READINGS

**First Reading** — He shall bring justice for the afflicted; the earth shall overflow with the knowledge of the Lord (Isaiah 11:1-10).

**Psalm** — Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever (Psalm 72).

**Second Reading** — Glorify God by living in harmony with one another, welcoming each other as Christ welcomed you (Romans 15:4-9).

**Gospel** — Produce good fruit worthy of your baptism; repent, for the reign of God is near.



## MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Hope is what gives us motivation and strength to live our life in the midst of all kinds of problems and struggles. Advent is the greatest season of hope, because in it God Himself gives us the assurance that He knows what we are dealing with and so He is coming to help us and to be part of our life, and we know that God will never fail.

The Israelites were at a great crisis situation. But through the prophet Isaiah God told them not to be afraid because better days of great peace and prosperity were on the way: days when “the wolf would be the guest of the lamb, calf and young lion browsing together, the baby playing by the cobra's den”, etc. This message gave great peace and tranquility to the people. It is the same message that God gives us also through Advent.

But the second Reading today reminds us that we need to do something to receive the blessings of God at this time. One of the things He is asking us to do is that we read and reflect on the Scriptures. “By endurance and by the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope”.

The Gospel reminds us that a wishy-washy attitude will not do. True repentance is what is called for. “The ax is laid at the root of the tree. ... only the wheat will be gathered into the barn, the chaff will be burned”. What is required is sincere sorrow for our sins. **Repentance means change of heart, change of attitude and behavior.**

Let us seriously reflect upon how our life is and make the necessary changes. God comes with His offer of help, support and peace. But **true inner peace is the fruit of obedience to the will of God.**

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul of Contra Costa County accepts cars as donations. They take cars that need only minor repairs and give them to those in need. Will you help?



Our Lady of  
Guadalupe  
Feast Day  
December 12



The Virgin of Guadalupe is the patron saint of Mexico and all the Americas. On December 9, 1531, in Mexico, Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego, a poor humble Aztec Indian who had recently converted to the Catholic faith. She asked him to go to the Bishop and tell him to build a church where she said "I will show and offer all of my love, my compassion, my help and my protection to my people." Juan Diego did as she asked, but the Bishop asked for a sign that this message was really from Our Lady.

Mary granted his request. On December 12, she showed Juan where the most beautiful Castilian roses were and told him to gather them. It was a miracle that the roses were there and in bloom because there was frost on the ground, and the ground was an infertile place where only cactus and thistles grew. After he gathered them, she helped arrange them in his tilma, or poncho, and told him to show them to the Bishop. When he brought them to the Bishop, the Bishop was amazed at the roses, but was even more amazed at what began to happen to Juan Diego's tilma. Right before their very eyes, the image of Our Lady began to form on the cloth. The picture of Mary was beautiful and the Bishop fell to his knees. He had the church built at her request. The tilma is still intact after 470 years. The colors have not faded and the cloth has not deteriorated. It has been on display in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe for all this time.
